Is counseling for you?

HONORING THE PAST, LIVING IN THE PRESENT, LOOKING TOWARDS THE FUTURE



In order for a person to be eligible for services they (1) must have been harmed, physically or emotionally, by the criminal act of a perpetrator(s) and (2) completed all intake forms and (3) reside or plan on residing in Humboldt County. Crimes may have occurred at any point in the individual's lifetime.
