Changes and/or clarifications to the bidding and contracting documents are as follows:

Questions Pertaining to the Request For Proposal:

1. **Do you have any Avenza compatible maps for this project or will the boundaries be flagged in case someone can't make the walk through?**

There are no maps compatible with Avenza available; however, GIS maps of the invasive species treatment areas were provided to those who attended the walk through and secondary maps will be given to the firm that has been selected. The sites will be flagged, but please note that access to tribal trust and fee lands requires prior approval and guidance from Trinidad Rancheria's Project Manager. There will not be a second walk through prior to bid selection.

2. **Do you know of any larger firms that are bidding on this project that might be able to use us [Forestscapes] for task 6 and 7?**

Unfortunately, we cannot disclose information about other firms bidding for this project. However, once a firm is selected, there may be an opportunity to subcontract with them for specific tasks. Please note that Trinidad Rancheria will only select one firm for the project, and it will be up to the other firms to decide how they allocate their funding and resources to those they choose to subcontract with.

3. **Is the use of machinery okay for this project?**

The use of heavy machinery, as well as pesticides will not be allowed for this project. However, chainsaws and hand tools are acceptable. Trucks and trailers can also be used to dispose of invasive plant material.

4. **If you don't want restoration or replanting done to a treatment area, what do you want?**

For the sites where eradication efforts will take place, our primary goal is to significantly reduce invasive species so that we can carry out further treatment on these sites in the future.

5. **Is cultural uses for replanting the most important priority for replanting efforts?**

Yes, the use of culturally significant plants for which the tribe can utilize for ceremony and medicine, is a top priority in our replanting efforts. The type, frequency, and location of native plant species will be determined in consultation with our Tribal Historic Preservation Officer prior to any eradication efforts.

6. **Are there any ways to get trucks to these treatment sites?**

Yes, at all treatment areas, there will be sufficient space for trucks and trailers to park for the disposal of invasive species.
